On Feb. 29, five local Fort Lauderdale charities will host the Fort Lauderdale Bus Loop, a fundraiser involving the Sun Trolley and 10 participating bars and restaurants traversing the City of Fort Lauderdale from the beaches to the downtown Riverwalk district.
